



### Exporting Goods through Tibar Bay Port

# Why should you read this guide?

The Government of Timor-Leste is committed to supporting the national economy by encouraging and facilitating legitimate commercial trade. As the government agency charged with the movement of goods across our borders, we play a pivotal role in protecting the country from the import and export of illegal or restricted goods, and we help to ensure that we collect the correct duties and taxes on behalf of the government.

## Tibar Bay Port



#### **Tibar Bay Port**

On September 30, 2022, Tibar Bay Port commenced operating and is now responsible for processing all containerized traffic arriving or departing by sea in Timor-Leste. The new facility will target productivity and performance levels in line with the world's biggest ports and boasts a modern infrastructure including a 630-meter quay and state-of-the-art equipment, including two Ship-to-Shore gantries, four Rubber-Tyred Gantries, ten terminal tractors, and 16 trailers. Tibar Bay Port will facilitate trade between Timor-Leste and the rest of the world, especially China, North Australia, and Asian countries. The new facility will also operate as a transshipment hub and a maritime gateway to the Asia-Pacific region.

#### Timor Port S.A.

Tibar Bay Port was built based on a Public-Private Partnership (PPP) between the Government of Timor-Leste and Timor Port S.A. (TPSA), a subsidiary of the Bolloré Group. Under this agreement, TPSA will operate and maintain Tibar Bay Port for the next 30 years and will be responsible for loading and unloading vessels, moving containers or other goods within the port area, and ensuring site security.

#### **Fees and Charges**

The Government of Timor-Leste established the fees and charges associated with using Tibar Bay Port through the Declaration of Rectification No. 19/2021 (Tariff Regime Associated with the Use of the Port of Tibar). These fees and charges are separate from any customs duties and taxes you may owe and should not be confused. #### Location

Tibar Bay Port is located on the western side of Tibar Bay, approximately 12 km (7.5 miles) west of Dili.







PART II Export Process



You must electronically lodge your DAU, along with all necessary supporting documents, within ASYCUDAWorld (AW).

AW will automatically route your DAU to either the Green Lane or the Orange Lane.

> You must apply a numerical seal(s) to your container(s) before arriving at Tibar Bay Port.



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Our team will X-Ray your container(s) when it arrives at Tibar Bay Port.

After we have undertaken our checks we will re-route your DAU to Green Lane in AW



You should bring the proof of payment notice to the Customs Cashier in our HQ office (Dili), and we will validate within ASYCUDAWorld.



Your DAU is now cleared by us and you can visit the TPSA Administration building to pay any applicable port handling fees or charges.

A member of staff from TPSA will issue you with a gate pass and you can now access the port to unload your container(s).

#### Step 1 - LODGE

You must electronically lodge your Declaração Aduaneira Única (DAU) within ASYCUDAWorld (AW) and copies of relevant documents. The process is entirely electronic, and you do not need to provide us with a hard copy of your documents.

In some cases, you may require additional export permits or licenses from other government agencies, but your customs broker can provide more information on this. You can also find further information by visiting the Customs Trade Portal at: www.customs.gov.tl From December 2, 2022, we no longer require you to pay any export processing fees, however; the TPSA may apply port handling fees or charges (described in Step 3).

You must apply a numerical seal(s) to your container(s) before arriving at Tibar Bay Port.

After you have lodged your DAU, the AW system will immediately route your DAU to either Green Lane or Orange Lane:



Green Lane: You can move directly to Step 2.



Orange Lane: This means we need to X-Ray your container(s) when it arrives at Tibar Bay Port. After we have undertaken our checks, we will re-route your DAU to Green Lane in AW, and you can move to Step 2.

#### Step 2 - VALIDATE

When you arrive at Tibar Bay Port, our team will check the seal number on your container(s) and validate the number(s) within AW. This process is fully automated, and you do not need to have any copies of any documents relating to the goods with you.

#### Step 3 - RELEASE

You can now head to the TPSA administration building to pay your port handling fees or charges. Once paid, the TPSA will issue you a gate pass allowing you to enter the port through the "IN Gate" and offload your container(s).
