PART I **Overview**



What is the Organic Structure of the Customs Authority?

The Organic Structure of the Customs Authority (Decree-Law 02/2020, dated January 8, 2020) represents our legal and organizational blueprint and will help us transform and enhance our operational capabilities. The legislation embodies our commitment to align with international standards, ensuring efficiency, transparency, and integrity in delivering our services. This legislation marks a significant milestone in our journey, establishing a robust management framework, fostering an accountability environment, and delineating our structure and functions. The legal text sets forth our mandate to facilitate trade, optimize revenue collection, secure our national borders, and contribute to Timor-Leste's economic prosperity and global trade participation.

Approval Process

The Organic Structure of the Customs Authority (Decree-Law 02/2020) underwent multiple steps before being approved and published, including:

- Approval: The government officially approved the Decree on August 23, 2019, demonstrating its commitment to revamping the Customs Authority.
- 2. Enactment: President Francisco Guterres Lú Olo enacted the Law on December 23, 2019, confirming its legal status.
- 3. **Publication**: The Journal of the Republic published the Decree on January 8, 2020, making it accessible to the public.
- Entry into Force: The Decree became effective on January 9, 2020, with its provisions set to be operational 90 days later, facilitating the necessary preparatory measures for implementation.

International Standards

This legislation signifies our dedication to aligning with international standards, modernizing our operations, and actively participating in the global customs community. We will achieve this by.

- Facilitating Trade: We follow key international provisions, including those required by the World Customs Organization, World Trade Organization, and ASEAN, to help streamline procedures, facilitate trade, and ensure security in global supply chains.
